The Obituary

FLORENCE INGRAM departed this life for a better one Saturday, April 9, 1994. She leaves to cherish her memory and rejoice her passing three loving and devoted sons, Joe (Sheila), Harold, and Percy.

Mrs. Ingram was born in Denmark, Tennessee on April 29, 1919 to her loving parents, Clara and John A. Bond. She was the first of four children, and survived two of them: Ira L. Smith (John L.) and Calvin Bond (Iola). She is in turn survived by one brother, John A. Bond, Jr (Marie).

Mrs. Ingram accepted Christ at an early age and remained steadfast in her faith. She was educated in the public schools in Denmark and after graduating from high school, was united in holy matrimony to John Ingram. Her sons were born from that union.

The Ingram Family migrated to Pontiac, Michigan in 1951 and joined with Providence Missionary Baptist Church shortly thereafter. Mrs. Ingram continued her education after arriving and during a period of layoff from her long-term employer, the General Motors Corporation, she earned certification as a licensed practical nurse and was employed by Pontiac General Hospital (now North Oakland Medical Center).

Mrs. Ingram was regarded as one of the "headlights" of Providence, which she truly regarded as her home away from home. She was a devoted supporter of the church in every respect, and served as a member of the Senior Choir, the Senior Usher Board, the Mission Society, and often assisted with inter-church communications.

In addition to her sons, Mrs. Ingram is survived by a grandson; her brother; five sisters-in-law; two brothers-in-law; many nieces and nephews; a host of other relatives, and a multitude of friends.
